Allison James was a Presbyterian school in Santa Fe which started in 1871. It was a girls school until 1908 when the Mary James School for Boys was added. The campus for the Boys and Girls Schools were two blocks away, but they had a combined faculty. In 1913, the boys were transferred to Menaul. The Girls school dropped the lower grades and became an accredited high school. In 1934, Allison-James was converted to an accredited junior high school for boys and girls in grades 7, 8, and 9. The boys basketball team competed against regular high school teams and entered the District 2 tournament in 1935. After drawing a bye in the first round, the Tigers lost in the second round 27-19 to the Espanola Hornets. After 1935, the Tigers competed at the Junior High Level.
