History of Community & School by Steve Flores

The town was settled by people from Texas and from the Midwest who homesteaded land in that area of eastern New Mexico. It was settled in 1905 and had its first post office in 1912. The town was originally called Rosedale until 1918. The community never had more than a few hundred people and a couple of stores. It was mainly a ranching and farming community. Today there are a few buildings that remain in the town, and fewer than 20 people live there.

By 1940, the population of area towns was declining rapidly. People began moving out of the area because of the drought. Soil banking was also a factor that led to the decreased population. Soil banking was the practice of the government to pay people to not farm their land. The government did this during the depression years to control prices. During the 1940's, many people moved to California to take war defense jobs. In 1940, Bellview consolidated with the neighboring community Hollene, to form the Rosedale school, located in the town of Bellview.
