History of Community & School by Steve Flores

Claud was named for its founder Claud V. Kelly, who came from Oklahoma. As with many others in the area, Kelly homesteaded the land. He opened a store and called it the Claud Store, which was the center of the area's cultural life. Eventually the store's name was adopted as the town name. The town is known as the first location to grow wheat in the area. Claud never had more than 200 people and a couple of stores. The Claud school was formed in 1917, and the buildings were used until the 1950's as an elementary school. The High School was never a 4 year high school. By 1929, the high schoolers started going to Pleasant Hill. Students from the Claud area now attend high school in either Clovis or Texico.
