## History of Community & School by Steve Flores

Colmor was settled in 1887 by homesteaders. The name "Colmor" was derived by taking the first three letters of the two counties it straddles, Colfax and Mora. In 1881, the AT & SF Railroad came through the area and brought the establishment of a depot. Colmor became a railroad town, used primarily to transport cattle to market. In the 1930's there was an idea to create a Colmor cut-off for the railroad. This would have helped the economy and prevented the town with several hundred residents from becoming a ghost town. In the 1930's Colmor was thriving with the Dow Store, and the Regensberg Store providing all the needed supplies. Colmor also had a hotel, barbershop, and a library. The idea to make Colmor Cut-Off was abandoned in the late 30's and the railroad pulled out. It made it extremely difficult to live there, because the railroad supplied the water. US Highway 85 bypassed the town as did Interstate 25 a few years later. Today it does not appear that any people live in the town. A few ruins of some of the old buildings, houses, and falling down school is all that remains.
