History of Community & School by Steve Flores

People of Spanish descent settled the town around 1862. The economy was tied to ranching and farming. The town never grew beyond 200 residents. The post office was the town center.

The school, known as Charles Pack School, was built around 1950. The high school did not have a gym, and the Coyotes played on an outside court. In 1965, the school merged with Gallinas to create Coronado. The school building was used as an elementary school and used for town functions until it burned in the 1980's. A new elementary school was built in front of the remains of the old school.
