History of Community & School by Steve Flores

Farley was established as a farming and ranching community in 1929. The town was named after its first postmaster. A branch of the AT & SF Railroad ran to Farley from Mt. Dora for a short time. The people hoped that the railroad would take more interest in the town, but this interest never materialized. The town at its peak, had nearly 500 residents. The first school in Farley was in buildings brought over from neighboring Wheatland. In the mid 1930's, a new school was built. with a gymnasium. The school was a WPA project.

People began moving out of the area in the 1940's. By the mid-1960's, Farley did not have enough students to justify a high school. Today there are several houses in the area, but no stores. The population is about 50.
