History of Community & School by Steve Flores

In 1907, Watt Farr moved to the area from Missouri with his family as homesteaders. Farr established a general store and a post office. Farr named the post office for his son, Forrest. The town of Forrest was mainly a farming and ranching area. Forrest never had more than a few hundred residents and a few stores. Most people lived on neighboring farms and would travel to Forrest for school. Today the town has fewer than 50 residents.

Forrest once had one of the finest high school facilities in New Mexico. Forrest High was a grand two story building with a gym attached. The entire school had fancy tin ceilings. A larger gym was built in the 1940's. Forrest High and its two gyms are still standing today. They are quite a site, even though the buildings are in bad shape. The backboards still hang in the old gnasium. In the locker rooms, there are chalkboards on the walls. The original gym is half the size of a regulation court. The Volunteer Fire Department station is located next to the school displays of the trophies and class pictures.
