### History of Community & School by Steve Flores

The town of Hachita was established in 1882. At that time, the area was known for mining. A mine was set up near the Hachet Mountains. Silver, lead, copper, and turquoise were mined there. The area grew quickly until the population approached 300. Mining began to decline in the 1890's and the town slowly died. In the early 1900's the EP & SW Railroad brought life to the community. The new Hachita was centered around the railroad. Hachita had a booming population until the 1960's when the railroad began to withdraw from the town. Today, fewer than 50 people live in the area and a convenience store is the only business.

The school is currently standing and in good shape. The gymnasium, which I have been told was impressive, was torn down in 2000. Students from the area now attend school in Animas.
