History of Community & School by Steve Flores

The school was part of what is now Highlands University. The University was called New Mexico Normal and Las Vegas Normal was the "lab" for the teacher training. The school included an elementary and secondary level. Normal High School graduated senior classes from 1903 until 1928. In 1928, the school lost its junior and senior classes but continued as a partial high school. Students had to attend Las Vegas High their last two years in order to graduate. In the fall of 1935, Normal reopened as a high school. In 1941, the Board of Regents voted to change the name to "Highlands." The school called Highlands would last for five years.

In 1945, a fire broke out in Las Vegas High School. This fire would ultimately lead to the end of both Las Vegas High and Highlands High. In 1946, a new school was built to replace the burned school. The board of Regents at Highlands felt it was time to consolidate the school with the East Las Vegas System and the new school. The new school as later renamed "Robertson High." Highlands High School ceased to exist after 1946, but their school colors (green and gold) remain alive at West Las Vegas.
