History of the Community and School by Steve Flores

The town was called Need and then Midwasy before the name was changed to Lingo. People who homesteaded founded the town in 1916. Most of the original settlers came from Texas and Oklahoma. The community is based on farming and ranching. The town never did have a booming population, but did have two grocery stores, a feed store, Baptist Church, post office, school and a teacherage. Today one house remains in the town. No stores are open and there is no longer a post office. Corn and cottln fields surrond the town. The Lingo School was a grand two story brick building with a fine gymnasium with bleachers on both sides. The school building, gym, and teacherage were torn down in the 1960's. Nothing remains of the Lingo School.
