History of the Community and School by Steve Flores

In 1908, the area was inspected by a group of land developers and promoters from Miami, Ohio. They decided the land was good for farming and began looking for people to move into the area. The interested the German Dunkards and other religious groups from the East to settle the area. At its peak, the town had several stores and a post office. The population never exceed a few hundred, however. By the early 1940's people began moving away from the town, mainly to find work in the urban areas. The depression and drought affected farming in the area and caused people to relocate. Today, the town has about 50 residents. No stores remain in the town.

The three story brick building that was once Miami High School was condemned in 1940, and torn down. On the site, a one story building was built. This was used as an elementary school until the early 1950's. Today that building is a private residence. The outdoor basketball court can still be seen behind the house. High school students started attending Springer in the fall of 1941.
