History of the Area and Early School by Steve Flores:

The Moreno Valley is the area that includes Eagle Nest, Angel Fire, and Red River. These towns are over 10,000 feet in elevation. In 1919, Charles Springer built a dam for irrigation in the Moreno Valley. The reservoir was named Eagle Nest Lake. The Eagle Nest area was inspired by a legend that Native Americans collected feathers in the area for ceremonial purposes. Springer stocked the reservoir with trout and the area became popular for fishermen and tourists. Today the Moreno Valley has several hundred year around residents. The area is known for the best skiing in New Mexico. Several stores are open year around. There are several motels in the area.

I spent an entire day looking for the old school No one in town knew of its existence. Later, I came across a book in Raton about old schools in Colfax county. The location of the Moreno Valley High School was listed as Sec. 19, T26N, R16E. There was also a picture of the school (Copy in Ghost Town Basketball) which showed the log cabin building with a gymnasium. The school was built in 1926, and burned down in 1952. The school was then moved to Eagle Nest. Moreno Valley then consolidated with Cimarron in 1953.
