### History of Town and School by Steve Flores

Tewa Pueblo Indians originally settled the area. In the 1600's , a Spanish settlement was established. This settlement died out in 1748 because of Ute and Commanche attacks. In the late 1700's, Spanish speaking people resettled the area. The name *Ojo Caliente* means Hot Spring in English. Today the economy of the community is largely tied to a resort that is esestablished next to the hot springs. People from all over the country and from other countries come to take mud baths and soak in the hot springs. The town has a couple of stores and several houses. The school is currently standing but has not been used for several years. The gymnasium was torn down in 2003.
