History of Town and School by Steve Flores

The town was originally set up by the Spanish in the mid 1700's. In 1930, the town was known for its peach orchards. Today the surrounding area has a population of about 700 . One store and a post office remain open.

The school was originally set up as a Catholic School in the early 1900's. Nuns from Massachusetts served as educators for the town school. The school later became a public school because of the Dixon case. The Dixon case declared it illegal for Catholic nuns to be paid as public school employees. Although the Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church did play a large role in the functioning of the school, the school was considered a public school for many years. The original school building was built in 1904. In 1941, the WPA built a two story school across from the church. After the closing of the high school, the building was used as an elementary school for several years. The building burned in 2003, and only the foundation remains.
