History of Town and School by Steve Flores

Homesteaders established Pleasant Hill in 1910. Lee Barnes, who suggested the name at a meeting one day, named the town. Barnes got the name from Pleasant Hill, Texas, a town that he liked. Pleasant Hill largely revolved on farming and ranching. The town had a couple of stores and a population of nearly 300 in its heyday. Today there are few houses in the area, but there is no sign of any business. There are no signs telling you that "You are in Pleasant Hill."

The school included a two story building, a gymnasium, and a sever apartment teacherage. In May 1949, the last high school class was graduated. In 1951, the elementary was closed. The buildings were torn down in the 1960's. All that remains is farmland.
