History of Town and School by Steve Flores

The town of Porter began in 1907. That year Jim and Mary Porter, homesteaders from Virginia, arrived in the area along with several other people. The Porters built a post office, a school, a church, and a community center in the area. The town was eventually named after them. The economy of Porter was based on farming and ranching. At its peak, the town had several stores and a population of about 500. The nearby Porter Lake served as a source of recreation for swimming in the summer and ice skating in the winter. People began to move out of the area in the late 1930's and early 1940's. By the mid 1950's the school had closed due to decreased enrollment. Today no one lives in the area. There is one abandoned store and a group of trees where the school once stood.

Porter had an attractive one level brick school building. In 1930, a large gymnasium was added. The school also had an army barracks building that became the lunchroom. The gym burned down in 1955, the last year the school was open. The other buildings were torn down in the 1960's.
