## History of Town and School by Steve Flores

The town of Quay was settled in 1902 by homesteaders from many other places. The town was named after Senator Mannhew Quay. The towns first postmaster, Simor J. Adamson proposed the name of Quay. The town at its peak, had a couple of merchantile stores, a church, school, and about 200 residents. The towns economy was largely based on ranching. Today, the school building and a few houses are all that remain in the area. Quay School was a one story building with eight classrooms and a cafeteria. After the high school slosed in the early 1940's, theschool was used as an elementary school until 1955. Students were then bussed to Tucumcari and Forrest. The building was used as a community center and was a meeting place for clubs and churches. Currently the building is in good condition and still used as a community center.
