## History of Town and School by Steve Flores

The history of Ranchvale dates back to 1916, when homesteaders settled the area. Vernon Tate, the first postmaster, named the town. The economy was based largely on ranching, as the name implies. The Ranchvale school was completed in 1917 and was the first consolidated school in New Mexico. Five other schools from the area consolidated with Ranchvale and moved their building to Ranchvale. The school remained a high school until 1957. In 1957, the school became part of Clovis municipal schools. The Ranchvale school has been used as an elementary school since.

Ranchvale once had a grand two story high school with a spacious gymnasium. In 1988, bothe buildings were torn down, and a new school and gym were built. The mascot was cut out of the original gym and is now hanging on the wall of the new gymnasium.
