History of the Town and School by Steve Flores

In 1907, St. Peter's Parish opened the first parochial school in the area in the Knights of Columbus Hall. The first school building was completed in 1921, located near the present site. The school accommodated 60 grade school students. In 1937, the Sisters of St. Casimir of Chicago began teaching at the school. In 1949, St. Peter's High School commenced operating by adding one grade each year. In 1953, a gymnasium was built across the street from the school. St. Peter's High School closed after Walker Air Force Base closed, an event that had a big effect on the local population. The school remained open as an elementary school and a middle school until 1970. The school buildings and gymnasium are currently used by St. Peter's Church for religious education purposes. The buildings are in good condition and are used several times each week.
