## History of the Town and School by Steve Flores

Stanley began as a NMC railroad siding and took the name of a man who was a railroad official and an engineer. The town was originally north of its present area. Originally a tent city, Stanley grew into a town with hotels, restaurants, and general stores. Many homesteaders settled the area because of the rich agricultural environment. Agriculture declined in the 1930's and the railroad pulled out in the 1940's. The town has an active post office and several dozen houses, a far cry from the town in its heyday.

The school and gym were used by the town of Stanley for recreation purposes for several years after closing the school. Nevertheless, the school and gymnasium were torn down in the early 1990's. The foundation of the school and gym is all that remains.
