History of Town and School by Steve Flores

Established in 1866, the name Tierra Amarilla means "yellow earth." The area has large amounts of clay deposits. That Pueblo Indians used for pottery, ceremonies, and stuccoing. The town was originally called Las Nutrias (the beavers) by the Spanish who first settled the area in the early 1800's. Tierra Amarilla eventually became the county seat for Rio Arriba County in the 1880's. The economy of the town was originally tied to farming and ranching. Today several hundred residents live in the town. There are several

A parking lot now covers the area where the gym once stood. Tierra Amarilla and Chama consolidated its schools in 1967, and created Escalante High School.
