History of Community & School by Steve Flores

Gallina is set in one of the most beautiful areas of the State of New Mexico. Pinetrees and green valleys surround the town. Gallina is located in the northwest foothills of the Jemez Mountains. Its history dates back to 1818, when it was known as Jacquez. Antonio Ortiz first settled it. Several other Hispanic families also moved the area during that time. In 1890, the community changed its name to Gallina, named for the Gallina Creek, which flows below the town. Gallina never had more than a couple hundred residents. The towns economy has been based on farming and ranching. Today, Gallina has a post office, a resuaurant, and a couple of convenience stores.

The school, built in 1950 was torn down in the 1960's. Students attended school in either Coyote or Cuba after 1955, untill a new school was built in 1965. The new school in Gallina was called Coronado, and educated children from Coyote as well as Gallina,
